1. Specifications

The purpose of this firm-fixed price contract is to obtain Razor Wire installation on Embassy Residences. The installation should meet the following specifications:

- a. Large size Ninja Razor Wire
- b. Straining wire 3mm
- c. Flat razor for sliding gates
- d. "T" wall studs fabricated in angle iron, galvanized steel
- e. Minimum depth stud insert into concrete 100mm
- f. Stud spacing should not be more than 1200 mm apart
- g. Gate supports must be welded on at site as per gate dimensions and specification.
- h. Sliding gates must use flat razor wire.

2. PERFORMANCE PERIOD, DELIVERABLES, AND DUE DATES

(a) After contract award and submission of acceptable insurance certificates, the Contracting Officer shall issue a Notice to Proceed. The Notice to Proceed will establish a date (a minimum of 3 days from date of contract award unless the Contractor agrees to an earlier date) on which performance shall start

All work under this contract shall not exceed 180 days after the start date shown in the Notice to Proceed.

(b) The Contractor shall deliver to a specific plan for installation of razor wire for each residence to the Contracting Officers Representative prior to the start of the installation at the residence.

Warranty - The contractor warrants items and services provided under FAR 52.212-4. The Contractor shall obtain and furnish to the Government all information required to make any subcontractor's, manufacturer's, or supplier's guarantee or warranty legally binding and effective. The Contractor shall submit both the information and the guarantee or warranty to the Government in sufficient time to permit the Government to meet any time limit requirements specified, but not later than completion and acceptance of all work under this contract.

3. Personnel Requirements

3.1 Removal of Personnel

The contractor shall:

- (a) maintain discipline at the site and at all times;
- (b) take all reasonable precautions to prevent any unlawful, riotous or disorderly conduct by or amongst those employed at the site; and
- (c) take all reasonable precautions for the preservation of peace and protection of persons and property in the neighborhood of the project against unlawful, riotous, or disorderly conduct.

The Contracting Officer may require, in writing, that the contractor remove from the work any employee that the Contracting Officer determines:

- (a) incompetent,
- (b) careless,
- (c) insubordinate or
- (d) otherwise objectionable, or
- (e) whose continued employment on the project is deemed by the Contracting Officer to be contrary to the Government's interests.

3.2 Construction Personnel Security - After award of the contract, the contractor has ten (10) calendar days to submit to the Contracting Officer a list of workers and supervisors assigned to this project for the Government to conduct security checks. It is anticipated that security checks will take 5 days to perform. For each individual the list shall include:

- (a) Full Name
- (b) Place and Date of Birth
- (c) Current Address
- (d) Identification number

Failure to provide any of the above information may be considered grounds for rejection and/or re-submittal of the application. Once the Government has completed the security screening and approved the applicants a badge will be provided to the individual for access to the site. The Government may revoke this badge at any time due to the falsification of data, or misconduct on site.

3.3 Language Proficiency - The Contractor's Manager assigned by the Contractor to superintend the work on-site, as required by FAR 52.236-6, "Superintendence by the Contractor", shall be fluent in written and spoken English.

4. Utilities - The Government cannot ensure that utilities will be available at all properties at all times. The Contractor shall have an alternate source of power (e.g., generator) available. The contractor shall not adjust the heating or air conditioning controls in properties with utilities turned on to maintain temperature. The Contractor shall have its own source of water available for clean up in the event that water has been turned off in the property for winterization of the plumbing system.

5. Insurance

Amount of Insurance - The Contractor's shall provide and maintain during the entire performance period the following insurance amounts and comply with F.A.R. 2.228-5, "Insurance Work on a Government Installation."

The Contractor shall include all costs in their offers for General Liability (includes premises/operations, collapse hazard, products, completed operations, contractual, independent contractors, broad form property damage, personal injury)

The Contractor shall obtain any other types of insurance required by local law. The Contractor agrees that the Government shall not be responsible for personal injuries or for damages to any property of the Contractor, its officers, agents, servants, and employees, or any other person, arising from and incident to the Contractor's performance of this contract. The Contractor shall hold harmless and indemnify the Government from

any and all claims, except in the instance of gross negligence on the part of the Government.

The Contractor shall obtain adequate insurance for damage to, or theft of, materials and equipment in insurance coverage for loose transit to the site or in storage on or off the site.

Government as Additional Insured - The Contractor shall name "the United States of America, acting by and through the Department of State", on a General Liability Policy as an additional insured with respect to operations performed under this contract.

Time for Submission of Evidence of Insurance - The Contractor shall provide evidence of the insurance required under this contract within ten (10) calendar days after contract award. Failure to timely submit this evidence, in a form acceptable to the Contracting Officer, may result in rescinding or termination of the contract by the Government.

6. Laws And Regulations

6.1 Compliance Required - The contractor shall, without additional expense to the Government, be responsible for complying with all host country laws, codes, ordinances, and regulations applicable to the performance of the work, and with the lawful orders of any governmental authority having jurisdiction. Host country authorities may not enter the construction site without the permission of the Contracting Officer.

Unless directed by the Contracting Officer, the contractor shall comply with the more stringent of:

- (a) the requirements of such laws, regulations and orders; or
- (b) the contract.

If a conflict among the contract and such laws, regulations and orders, the contractor shall promptly advise the Contracting Officer of the conflict and recommend a proposed course of action for resolution by the Contracting Officer.

6.2 Labor, Health And Safety Laws And Customs - The contractor shall comply with all local labor laws, regulations, customs and practices pertaining to labor, safety, and similar matters, unless doing so would be inconsistent with the requirements of this contract.

6.3 Subcontractors - The contractor shall give written assurance to the Contracting Officer that all subcontractors and others performing work on or for the project have obtained all required licenses and permits.

6.4 Evidence Of Compliance - The contractor shall submit proper documentation and evidence of compliance with this clause to the Contracting Officer.

7. Safety Accident Prevention

(a) General. The contractor shall provide and maintain work environments and procedures that will:

(1) safeguard the public and Government personnel, property, materials, supplies, and equipment exposed to contractor operations and activities;

(2) avoid interruptions of Government operations and delays in project completion dates; and

(3) control costs in the performance of this contract. For these purposes, the contractor shall: (i) Provide appropriate safety barricades, signs and signal lights; (ii) Comply with the standards issued by any local government authority having jurisdiction over occupational health and safety issues; and (iii) Take any additional measures the Contracting Officer determines to be reasonably necessary for this purpose.

(b) Records. The contractor shall maintain an accurate record of exposure data on all accidents incident to work performed under this contract resulting in:

(1) death,

(2) traumatic injury,

(3) occupational disease, or

(4) damage to or theft or loss of property, materials, supplies, or equipment.

The contractor shall report this data as directed by the Contracting Officer.

(c) Subcontracts. The contractor shall be responsible for its subcontractors' compliance with this clause.

(d) Written Program. Before starting the work, the contractor shall:

(1) Submit a written proposal for implementing this clause; and

(2) Meet with the Contracting Officer to discuss and develop a mutual understanding of the overall safety program.

(e) The Contracting Officer shall notify the contractor of any non-compliance with these requirements and the corrective actions required. The contractor shall immediately take corrective action after receiving the notice. If the contractor fails or refuses to promptly take corrective action, the Contracting Officer may issue an order suspending all or part of the work until satisfactory corrective action has been taken. The contractor shall not be entitled to any equitable adjustment of the contract price or extension of the performance schedule for any suspension of work issued under this clause.

8. Working Hours

All work shall be performed during the period of 0700 to 1800 Monday through Friday except for the holidays identified below. Other hours, if requested by the Contractor, may be approved by the Contracting Officer's Representative. The Contractor

shall give 24 hours in advance to COR who will consider any deviation from the hours identified above. Changes in work hours will not be a cause for a price increase.

(b) Certification. By submitting this offer, the offeror certifies that it is not:

- (1) Taking or knowingly agreeing to take any action, with respect to the boycott of Israel by Arab League countries, which Section 8(a) of the Export Administration Act of 1979, as amended (50 U.S.C. 2407(a)) prohibits a United States person from taking; or,
- (2) Discriminating in the award of subcontracts on the basis of religion.
