The U.S. Embassy in Accra, Ghana is seeking an individual for the position of a **SECURITY ELECTRONICS TECHNICIAN** in the Engineering Services Office (ESO) of the Embassy.

### **BASIC FUNCTION OF POSITION**

Incumbent conducts inspection, installation, maintenance and repair of unclassified technical security equipment and devices; studies and make recommendations for ways to

improve the effectiveness of the security systems at U. S. Government posts in the West African Region including Accra, Cotonou, and Lome.

Duties include but not limited to inspecting, installing, maintaining and making recommendations for revision and improvement of the security equipment and devices; maintaining and repairing all closed circuit television and related equipment, walk through and hand-held metal detectors; performing installation, trouble shooting and repair of the intruder alarm devices, upgrading public address systems; maintaining locking devices, power supplies; and keeping records and ensuring adequate stocks of all the components and spares for the repair of the above equipment.

## **QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED**

NOTE: All applicants must address each selection criterion detailed below with specific and comprehensive information supporting each item.

1. Completion of two-year diploma program in Electronics/Electrical/Mechanical engineering from a reputed institution.
2. At least five years of hands-on field experience in major repairs and installation of electrical and heavy-duty mechanical equipment, closed circuit television, alarm systems, public address and vehicle arrest systems.
3. Would be beneficial but not mandatory to have training on: CCTV, residential alarm systems, welding, public address systems, technical security systems, soldering, etc.
- 4. Level III (Good Working Knowledge) English and Twi is required. Able to write acceptable drafts in English and literate drafts in Twi.**
- 5. Should have initiative and good knowledge of power systems, use of basic electrical/ electronic of test equipment, trouble shoot, and repair electrical/electronic and mechanical equipment.**
6. Must be able to apply knowledge in the installation and maintenance of security Equipment; able to read blueprints and schematic diagrams of electrical and mechanical drawings, and make major adjustments and repairs. Must have the ability to use electronic test equipment, and use knowledge and skills to rectify problems associated with security equipment independently. **Must be able to drive a motor vehicle with a manual transmission.**

## **SELECTION PROCESS**

When equally qualified, US Citizen Eligible Family Members (AEFMs) and U.S. Veterans will be given preference. Therefore, it is essential that the candidate address the required qualifications above in the application.

## **ADDITIONAL SELECTION CRITERIA**

1. Management will consider nepotism/conflict of interest, budget, and residency status in determining successful candidacy.
2. Current employees serving a probationary period are not eligible to apply.
3. Currently employed US Citizen EFMs who hold a FMA appointment are ineligible to apply for advertised positions within the first 90 calendar days of their employment.
4. Currently employed NORs hired under a Personal Services Agreement (PSA) are ineligible to apply for advertised positions within the first 90 calendar days of their employment, unless currently hired into a position with a When Actually Employed (WAE) work schedule.

**Interested applicants for this position must submit the following or the application will not be considered:**

1. Application for U.S. Federal Employment Form (SF-171 or OF-612); or
2. A current resume or curriculum vitae that provide the same information as an OF-612.
3. Candidates who claim U.S. Veterans preference must provide a copy of their Form DD-214 with their application.
4. Any other documentation (e.g., essays, certificates, awards, copies of degrees earned) that addresses the qualification requirements of the position as listed above.

**DEFINITIONS**

1. AEFM: A type of EFM that is eligible for direct hire employment on either a Family Member Appointment (FMA) or Temporary Appointment (TEMP) provided s/he meets all of the following criteria:
  - US citizen;
  - Spouse or dependent who is at least age 18;
  - Listed on the travel orders of a Foreign or Civil Service or uniformed service member permanently assigned to or stationed at a US Foreign Service post or establishment abroad with a USG agency that is under COM authority;
  - Is resident at the sponsoring employee's or uniform service member's post of assignment abroad, approved safehaven abroad, or alternate safehaven abroad; and
  - Does not receive a USG annuity or pension based on a career in the US Civil, Foreign or uniform services.
2. EFM: Family Members at least age 18 listed on the travel orders of a Foreign of Civil Service or uniformed service member permanently assigned to or stationed to a US Foreign Service post or establishment abroad with a USG agency that is under COM authority who do not meet the definition of AEFM above.
3. Member of Household: A MOH is a person who: 1) Has accompanied, but is not/not on the travel orders of a U.S. citizen Foreign or Civil Service employee or uniform service member permanently assigned to or stationed at a U.S. Foreign service post or establishment abroad; 2)

Has been declared by the sponsoring employee to the Chief of Mission as part of his/her household; and 3) Resides at post with the sponsoring employee.

4. Ordinarily Resident (OR): A citizen of the host country or a citizen of another country who has shifted the main residency focus to the host country and has the required work and/or residency permits for employment in country.
5. Not-Ordinarily Resident (NOR): Typically NORs are US Citizen EFMs and EFMs of FS, GS, and uniformed service members who are eligible for employment under an American USG pay plan, on the travel orders and under Chief of Mission authority, or other personnel having diplomatic privileges and immunities.
